

# **MSDA Quick-Start Guide**


In EasyBridge, confirm that both **enVision Mathematics** and **SuccessMaker Math** products have been added to the class.

### **Teachers: Assigning the Screener**


- 1. Navigate to Realize
- 2. From the home page, select your class
- 3. In the left menu, click **Programs** and click on enVision Mathematics
- 4. From the table of contents, select Mathematics Screener and Diagnostic

#### **Assessments**

- 5. Select the Screener Assessment
- 6. Select the leveled Screener Assessment in the left menu to access the Assign button



- 7. Click assign
- 8. Complete the **Create Assignment** screen with **Start** date, **Due** date, **Assign to**, and click **Assign**.



### Students: Log in and complete Screener


1. Log into EasyBridge and navigate to Realize

IMPORTANT: Students should not select SuccessMaker Math in EasyBridge at this time. They need to complete both MSDA assessments in Realize first.

2. From Home page, click on the **Screener Assessment** 



3. Select the Leveled Screener Assessment

### Teachers: Interpreting Screener Results to Manually Assign Diagnostic

Scoring the Screener is a manual process that must be completed prior to assigning the Diagnostic. Using the cut scores on the Diagnostic Recommendation Table, determine the appropriate level Diagnostic to assign to each student.

#### **Diagnostic Recommendation Table**

Grade & Screener Levels	Cut Score	Recommended Diagnostic Assessment	
		Less Than Cut Score	Greater Than or Equal to Cut Score
Kindergarten Level A		All students should be assigned the Level A Diagnostic Assessment.	
Grade 1 Level B	50% (10 out of 20)	Level A Diagnostic Assessment	Level B Diagnostic Assessment
Grade 2 Level C	45% (10 out of 22)	Level B Diagnostic Assessment	Level C Diagnostic Assessment
Grades 3-5 Levels D-F	40% (10 out of 25)	Prior-grade level Diagnostic	On-grade level Diagnostic (matches the Screener level)
Grades 6-8 Levels G-I	36% (11 out of 30)	Prior-grade level Diagnostic	On-grade level Diagnostic (matches the Screener level)


For example, a student in Grade 3 scoring a 40% (10 out of 25) on the Level D Screener Assessment should take the on-grade Level D Diagnostic Assessment. A classmate scoring 36% (9 out of 25) should take the prior-grade Level C Diagnostic Assessment.

### **Teachers: Assigning Diagnostic Assessment**

- 1. From the home page, select your class
- 2. In the left menu, select **Programs** and select **enVision Mathematics** program
- 3. From the table of contents, select Mathematics Screener and Diagnostic

#### **Assessments**

- 4. Select the correct level Diagnostic Assessment
- 5. Select the **level Diagnostic Assessment** in the left menu to access the Assign button
- 6. Click Assign
- 7. Complete the **Create Assignment** screen with **Start** date, **Due** date, **Assign to**, and click **Assign**.



## Students: Complete en Vision Mathematics Diagnostic Assessment


1. Log into EasyBridge and navigate to Realize.

IMPORTANT: Students should not select SuccessMaker Math in EasyBridge at this time. Both MSDA assessments should be completed in Realize first.

2. From Home page, click on the Level Diagnostic Assessment



3. Click on the **Level Diagnostic Assessment** 




4. Select Start

#### 5. Click **Submit** when finished


Diagnostic Assessment results are available immediately. Once students submit the Diagnostic Assessment, it takes **24 hours** for the results to sync with SuccessMaker. After **24 hours**, students can begin working in SuccessMaker.

Based on the student's score on the Diagnostic assignment, MSDA will generate the initial Math course assignment for the student in SuccessMaker.





IMPORTANT: If teachers try to assign SuccessMaker before students complete the Screener and Diagnostic, they will be prompted with this message:



It's important to note that teachers do not assign any assignments within their SuccessMaker dashboard as it's an automated process that is completed when the MSDA is completed by each student.
