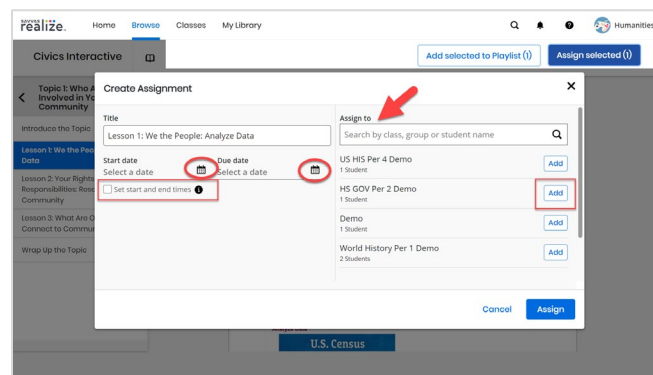


Explore How to Make an Assignment



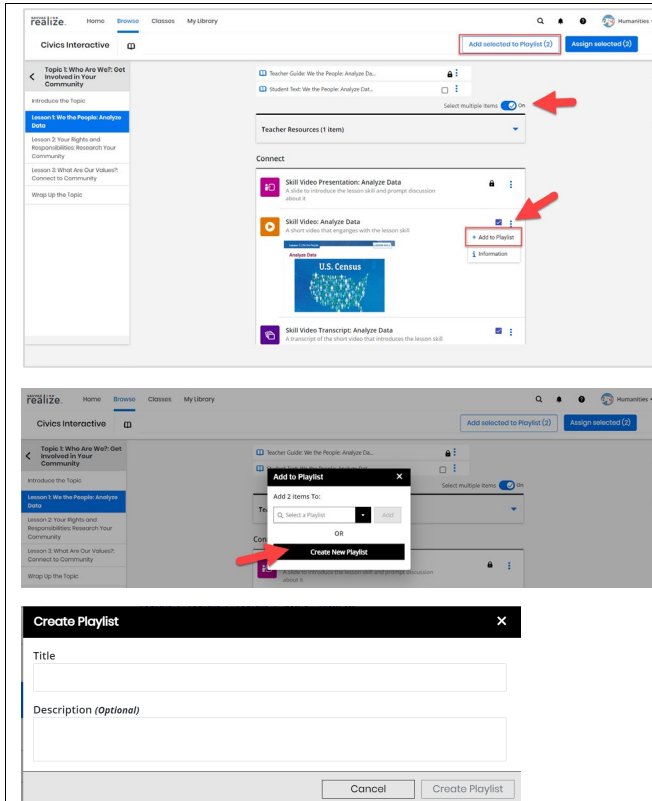
Within a topic or lesson-level options, select the desired content to assign to students. (Note: You can make multiple assignments at one time by turning on the “Select multiple items” option ON, and then checking the box next to content you wish to assign). Click **Assign Selected**. The **Create an assignment** box will display. Practice making an assignment.

- Enter the Start and Due dates
- Set a start and end time (This reduces students’ ability to share answers)
- Add any instructions in the Instructions box
- Enter a class, group or student name; select from the options that appear or simply click **Add** next to the available class options
- Click **Cancel** (if you are just practicing) or click **Assign** to assign content to your students. A confirmation will appear.



Explore How to Create a Playlist

From the topic or lesson-level options (with the Select multiple items toggle On), check the boxes next to the desired content you wish to include in a playlist. Click **Add to Playlist** next to single item or **Add selected to Playlist** for multiple items.

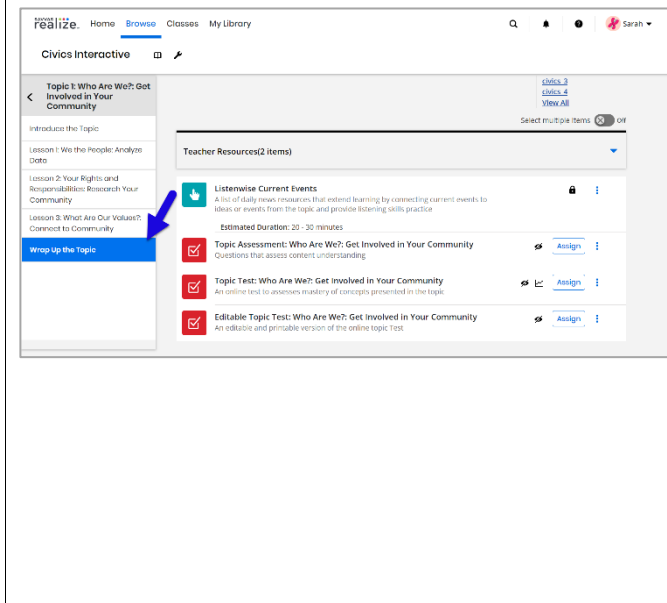


Next, in the **Add to Playlist box**, click **Create New Playlist**. Type a title and optional description, then click **Create Playlist**.

Playlists can contain a unique combination of content that can be assigned at any time to your students. It's a great way to organize what you want to include as part of your classroom. It can also be used to organize differentiation support for a particular group of students.
